The Beloved Christ Church Cross

Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim... till all the world adore his sacred name.

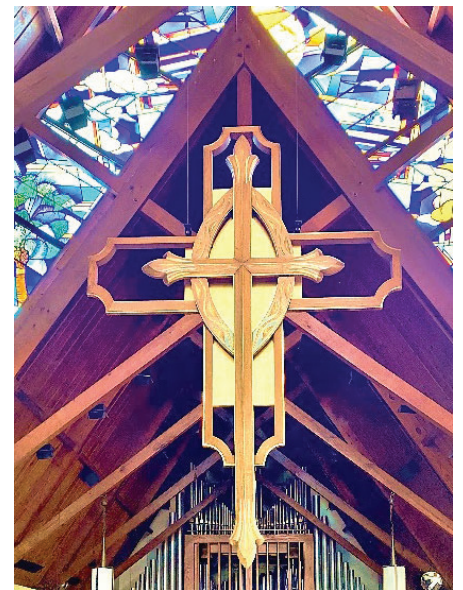
Generations of parishioners have worshiped together in the presence of our beloved Christ Church cross. Prominently displayed above the altar, framed by colorful, nature-themed stained-glass windows, this beautiful symbol of Christ's sacrifice commands attention when you enter the church.

With its fleur-de-lis designed tip points and surrounding ellipse, the cross has been a beloved part of the life of our church since its initial appearance, yet few know its history.

It was designed not long after the church's founding in 1951, by The Rev. Alexander "Sandy" Juhan, the first rector of Christ Church, in collaboration with the J&R Lamb Studios of New York. According to church archives, the cross was "given to the glory of God" by Rex and Charlotte Thames in loving memory of their sons.

In 1984 when the church was expanded, the Rev. James Cooper, rector at the time, decided the cross needed to be enlarged as well to be more prominently visible in the larger space. The Thames family architect Jack Diamond and the Rambusch Company enhanced the original cross design to include the outer frame.

Today, this version of the cross, with its fleur-de-lis designed tip points and surrounding ellipse, is also the centerpiece of the altar in the Jordan service.



A brass version, dedicated to Octavia "Tay" Cooper's years of service to Christ Church, is carried in the procession each Sunday in the main church sanctuary.



This indelible image of Christ's love for us has also been fashioned as a pendant to be awarded for service, and it is proudly worn and cherished by many long-time parishioners.

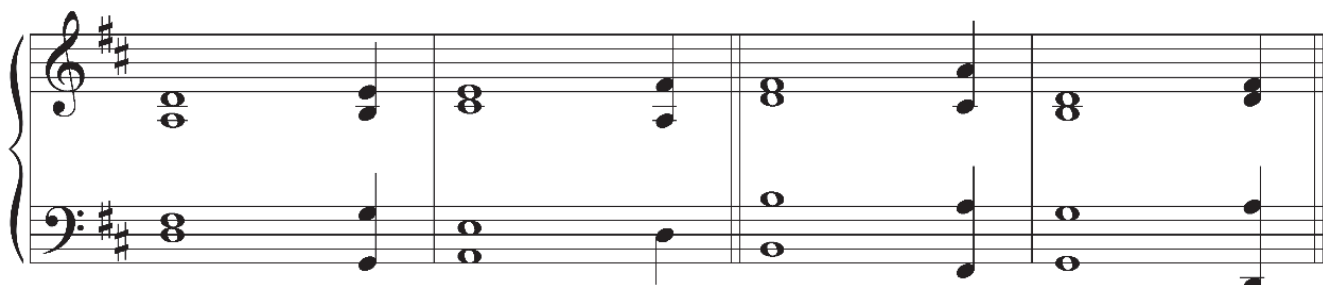

Lector A reading from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians

1:10-18

Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: “Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles— the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned.”

From that time Jesus began to proclaim, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.” As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, “Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.” Immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him.

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.
