A Clear Call to Ordained Ministry

Margaret Henderson remembers the exact day and the exact time she experienced a dramatic spiritual conversion, what she calls “a baptism by the Holy Spirit.”

It was April 21, 2021, during the 11:15 a.m. Jordan Service at Christ Church, with Father Remington Slone preaching. Suddenly, she says, she was “overcome by a sense of the passion,” and “a release from the bondage of self, which was supernatural and unexpected and overwhelming.”

It was also the climax to months of reflection during the Covid shutdown, which had given her “the gift of space” to get clear on what she’d been experiencing as a call from God to become more involved in spreading the Gospel.

The experience was so powerful that over the next many months she entered a formal discernment process to determine if what she was feeling was a call to ordained ministry, a process that continues for her today. Margaret met regularly with Father Keith, her sponsoring priest.

Blessed with the support of her husband, Shawn, together she and he discerned that God was asking her to pursue the call full time, which meant shutting down her thriving business as a federal lobbyist in Washington D.C. She could no longer do her job, she says, “because I was so filled with a desire to study scripture and proclaim the Gospel and dedicate myself to this call. I had to make a choice.” Since the clients she represented as a lobbyist for 17 years were the American fishing industry, that call was amazingly clear: God was telling her to drop her net and follow him. It was a financial sacrifice she didn’t hesitate to make. She’d grown up in Christ Church and after high school had moved to Washington to work as a congressional staff member on Capitol Hill before starting her lobbyist business. When she and Shawn and their three children moved back to Ponte Vedra Beach in 2016, she’d continued commuting to Washington, maintaining “a manic” schedule that left little time for self-reflection. When the pandemic ended her commute, “that Covid space forced me to sit back and assess my vocation,” she says. “And it was during that time that the Holy Spirit worked its magic.”

After months of meeting with the Christ Church Discernment Committee, they affirmed her call, and so has the Christ Church clergy, the vestry, the Diocese Commission on Ministry, and The Right Reverend Samuel Johnson, Bishop of Florida, who has approved her as an Aspirant to Holy Orders. Her next step is an internship with a church in the diocese.

She is moved to proclaim the Gospel here at Christ Church as well. She co-hosts our Living Breathing Stories podcast, which gives guests an opportunity to testify to the work of God in their lives. And she co-leads the Living, Loving, Learning Women’s Bible Study. Filled with “love and immeasurable gratitude” for God’s clear call, Margaret says she realized, “I can’t keep it unless I give it away.”
