Youth and Adult Classes

Bishop Chip Stokes will be with us May 7 at 6:30 pm for Confirmation. All are welcome to attend the service and a brief reception in the courtyard afterwards.

In Confirmation, baptized persons are "confirmed" in the Christian faith with the laying on of hands by a bishop, as we ask the Holy Spirit to bless those who reaffirm the faith they professed in Baptism or claim the Baptismal promises made on their behalf. Confirmation is a time of exploration, discovery and commitment where participants grow in community with God and each other as well as engage in the life of the Church.

Youth Confirmation classes started in October. This year we have 23 young people in 9-12 grades in the class. Along with attending classes approximately twice a month on Sunday afternoons, they have been encouraged to dive deeper into the life of the church through regular worship attendance and the opportunity to participate in service projects together.

Adult confirmation classes will begin April 7 and run through May 5. These classes are for those new to the Episcopal Church, those with questions about our church, and for those who

The classes will meet in the Hospitality Room from 10:15-11:00 during the Formation Hour, with an additional class time together the last weekend in April.



Kyrie Rachel Kamps




