# Confirmation

## Youth and Adult Classes

Bishop Chip Stokes will be with us May 7 at 6:30 pm for Confirmation. All are welcome to attend the service and a brief reception in the courtyard afterwards.

In Confirmation, baptized persons are “confirmed” in the Christian faith with the laying on of hands by a bishop, as we ask the Holy Spirit to bless those who reaffirm the faith they professed in Baptism or claim the Baptismal promises made on their behalf. Confirmation is a time of exploration, discovery and commitment where participants grow in community with God and each other as well as engage in the life of the Church.

Youth Confirmation classes started in October. This year we have 23 young people in 9-12 grades in the class. Along with attending classes approximately twice a month on Sunday afternoons, they have been encouraged to dive deeper into the life of the church through regular worship attendance and the opportunity to participate in service projects together.

Adult confirmation classes will begin April 7 and run through May 5. These classes are for those new to the Episcopal Church, those with questions about our church, and for those who want to reaffirm their commitment to a Christian life of faith.

## The Gospel

They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, “Sir, we wish to see Jesus.” Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, “The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

“Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—‘Father, save me from this hour’? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.” Then a voice came from heaven, “I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.” The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.” He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.
