New Leaders for Altar Guild

As leader of the Christ Church Altar Guild for the past five years, Kathy Lowry has scheduled, recruited, and trained the ministry's approximately 60 volunteers. She's also been involved with ordering new supplies for the altar, overseeing repairs, polishing altar items, and coordinating

special events with clergy.

The leadership role is a huge commitment, as it includes scheduling volunteers for multiple services every Sunday, "and it's been a privilege," Kathy says.

Now Kathy plans to step down from that role, while continuing to serve as an altar guild volunteer under two new leaders, Pam Mitchell and Martha Stachitas.

Pam, who's been an altar guild volunteer since joining the church in 2005, says she feels "honored and blessed to have the opportunity to Kathy Lowe lead such a special ministry, a very sacred ministry. You are preparing the Lord's table and it's a sacred space—Holy Ground."

Martha, another longtime altar guild volunteer, says she felt flattered to be asked. Since retiring from her job, she has been looking for a way to become more involved with the church. "This is a call to service," she says, although Kathy Lowry and her assistant ministry leader Pat Latimer, "will be tough acts to follow."

In the Episcopal church, the altar is set up in a very precise way, and items, which are stored in the sacristy room behind the choir loft, all have names that new volunteers must learn.

"Altar Guild is a very behind the scenes ministry," Kathy says, because members set up the altar before the service begins and take it down after the service ends. But she considers it a very special ministry, a tight knit one that has allowed her to meet many people and make many friends who she wouldn't have otherwise had the opportunity to meet.
