DID YOU KNOWS

Christ Church is a loving community that includes and welcomes everyone, at any point in life and from any background, offering opportunities to engage and grow in faith at every age and situation, helping you develop in your relationship with God.

We offer Sunday worship in nine services across two sites. Our average weekly worship attendance is **914** in person, and **240** online. We also host the largest **Hispanic congregation** in our diocese.



As a church family we celebrated **51 Baptisms** and **15 Weddings** in 2023. We mourned together at **38 Funerals**, and we welcomed **14** students and **10** adults into the life of the church through **Confirmation**, **Reception**, and **Reaffirmation** of faith.

100s of children and youth participate in our Family Ministry programs, which provide essential spiritual formation, fellowship, and support. 100s of children attend Christ Church Preschool, and their families are frequent visitors to our campus.



Bible studies, book studies and small groups meet on and off campus nearly every day of the week. Love First Vacation Bible Study hosted 240 children and youth in 2023.

In addition to the nearly 400 children and adult Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts who meet on our Ponte Vedra Campus, we host 100s of community meetings and events throughout the year, including our annual Community Oyster Roast & Cookout which has grown along with our campus, to serve some 600-800 attendees.

12 step programs meet here nearly every day of the week, and our **Recovery Ministry** hosts workshops throughout the year, connecting people with resources.

The Creative Academy at Christ Church engages 100s of families and 1,000s of attendees in arts lessons, rehearsals, exhibits and performances.




