Are You a Good Listener?

Jesus says, “He who has ears to hear, let him hear.” (Mark 4:9) We all have ears, but do we use them? Adults often scold children for not listening, but the reality is, adults are generally not very good at it either.

Listening is a skill that needs to be learned and practiced. And that is exactly what Community of Hope International (also known as COHI) is all about.

Community of Hope describes itself as a school for God’s service. The mission statement is: Creating communities steeped in Benedictine spirituality, to serve others through compassionate listening. (More on the Benedictine part in a minute!) We often call it “the art of holy listening.”

We are one of hundreds of faith communities around the world that have formed a COHI group. Since 2020, dozens of members of Christ Church have completed COHI training and have gone on to apply the skills they’ve learned in a variety of ways. COHI graduates also gather once a month for fellowship, learning, and reinforcement of our listening skills.

The class is led by Deacon Leila Quinlan, Malinda Harris, and Jennifer Arnold. It meets for 11 weeks. Class cohorts work together to learn and practice holy listening within the framework of the ancient rule of St. Benedict, using Sister Joan Chittister’s book, *The Rule of Benedict: Insights for the Ages*, as a guide. Participants learn techniques to help improve communication skills, set boundaries, recognize the influence of family systems, and more.

COHI graduates practice their holy listening in many ways: visiting residents at local care facilities, teaching ESOL classes, ministering to shut-ins, and serving visitors to Mission House. And aside from these more formal examples of ministry, all graduates express how much their training has impacted their personal relationships with parents, spouses, children, and friends.

In the coming months, look for more opportunities to learn about COHI. We’ll host information tables in the Fellowship Hall during Sunday breakfasts, and graduates will be sporting “Ask Me About Community of Hope” buttons at church. You can also learn more at cohinternational.org. We’d love to tell you more about our experiences and answer any questions you may have. In the meantime, prayerfully consider your listening skills, and if this opportunity calls to you.

Lector A reading from the Book of Exodus

16:2-4, 9-15

The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. The Israelites said to them, "If only we had died by the hand of the Lord in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots and ate our fill of bread; for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger."

Then the Lord said to Moses, “I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not.”

Then Moses said to Aaron, “Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites, ‘Draw near to the Lord, for he has heard your complaining.’” And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked toward the wilderness, and the glory of the Lord appeared in the cloud. The Lord spoke to Moses and said, “I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, ‘At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you shall know that I am the Lord your God.’”

In the evening quails came up and covered the camp; and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, “What is it?” For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, “It is the bread that the Lord has given you to eat.”

There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people."

(When it says, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.
