Caring for the Caregiver Series

Are you, or is someone you know caring for a loved one? Would you like to connect with people and services that might help? Please join us beginning in August for a four-week series, hosted by **Caring Connections at Christ Church**.

Series facilitator **Toula Wootan** has assembled a group of local experts in various aspects of caregiving, to offer advice, comfort and support, and to ensure that No One Walks Alone. Toula herself is an expert in caregiver support. She founded the Community Hospice Veterans Partnership, and the Caregiver Coalition of Northeast Florida, a non-profit partnership that serves elders and their caregivers.

On **August 13** Doug Schilling, LCSW, Community Hospice and Palliative Care will begin our series with an overview, Caring for the Caregiver, outlining the changing roles of caregivers, and addressing the impact that the stress of caregiving has on mind, body and spirit.

On **August 20**, Mike Jorgensen, JD, LLM, an Attorney at Senior Counsel will address the topic of Preservation of Assets in Long Term Care Planning.

On August 27 we will hear from Cari Ann Eyre, Division Director, Division of Alzheimer's and Brain Health for the Florida Department of Elder Affairs, on Caring For A Loved One With Alzheimer's Disease. Jenny Lehman, LCSW, Psychotherapist and National Trainer for RTM will discuss the unique challenges of Caring For A Loved One With Cancer.

And our series will conclude on **September 10** with a Panel of Experts on Senior Care and Caregiving: Linda Levin, CEO, ElderSource; Michael Saffy, Owner, Silver Link Consulting; Becky Yanni, Executive Director, and Paulette Kozlowski, Adult Day Services Manager, St. Johns County Council on Aging

Then the Lord said, "See, I am setting a plumb line in the midst of my people Israel; I will never again pass them by; the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate, and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword."

The Gospel

Gospeler The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark 6:14-29

People **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

King Herod heard of Jesus and his disciples, for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, "John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him." But others said, "It is Elijah." And others said, "It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old." But when Herod heard of it, he said, "John, whom I beheaded, has been raised."

For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because Herod had married her. For John had been telling Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." And Herodias had a grudge against him, and wanted to kill him. But she could not, for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he protected him. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed; and yet he liked to listen to him. But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his courtiers and officers and for the leaders of Galilee. When his daughter Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests; and the king said to the girl, "Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it." And he solemnly swore to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom." She went out and said to her mother, "What should I ask for?" She replied, "The head of John the baptizer." Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, "I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter." The king was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for his oaths and for the guests, he did not want to refuse her. Immediately the king sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison, brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother. When his disciples heard about it, they came and took his body, and laid it in a tomb.
