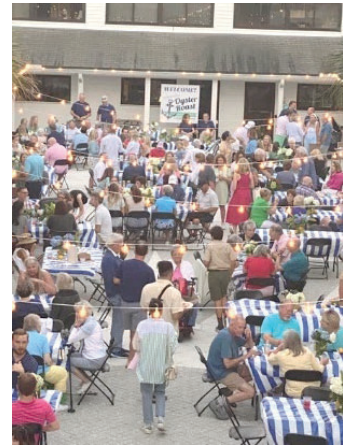

Dear Parish Family,

This week marked the halfway point in our annual campaign – **Better Together** - we want to extend a heartfelt *thank you* to all those who have faithfully turned in their pledge cards. Your commitment is already helping our Finance Committee and Vestry plan to complete the 2025 budget.



However, we need to share where we stand. While many have generously responded, **only one-third of the households** who pledged last year and remain part of our community have submitted their pledges for 2025. This leaves us with **over \$1.2 million potentially missing from the budget**. We are excited to welcome **49 new pledges** from new members or those pledging for the first time – **thank you for participating!** Participation is key – any amount - we are Better Together!

Our goal is to raise \$4.5 million to support our 2025 budget, which is necessary to keep our campus and ministries thriving. As of October 20th, we have received approximately **\$2.3 million** in pledges and gifts. We are asking for your help to close this gap before our In-Gathering Sunday on **November 3rd**. The \$4.5 million goal will come from \$3.5 million in pledges, and approximately \$1 million we receive in non-designated gifts and other income.



Following Jesus Christ and with the help of God, we want to continue offering the facilities, programs and ministries that bring life to our parish: **yes**, including keeping the **lights on**, the **coffee** brewing, the **classrooms** and **fellowship** spaces ready for all our gatherings, the Oyster Roast, the Wednesday dinners, and so much more. We also want to ensure that **our outreach partners can continue counting on Christ Church** for support.

Your generosity helps feed over 700 visitors at **Mission House**, provide essentials for those in need through **BEAM**, and deliver over **800,000 pounds of food** annually. It allows us to sustain our **Cuba Ministry** that supports **1,000+ children**, to house and feed the orphans at **Amistad in Bolivia**, and to expand care for the children escaping war and severe poverty in **South Sudan** through **Amazing Grace**.
