Welcome to the Season of Advent

Did you know that the season of Advent is the first season of the church year? It begins with the 4th Sunday before Christmas and continues through the day before Christmas. The name is derived from a Latin word for “coming”. This season is a time for preparation and expectation for the coming celebration of our Lord’s nativity, and for the final coming of Christ in power and glory.

You see, in this special season, **we can experience God coming to us in a variety of ways.** Many of us relate to young Mary and her bold “Yes” to God. Some cherish the tiny baby born in the humblest of circumstances and some relate more to the coming of the Light into a dark world – the light of Christ made visible and tangible to us. Some may relate to Joseph, faithful in his commitment to Mary even in very confusing circumstances. Finally, some may focus on the Innkeeper and finding “space” for Jesus.

Whatever way you choose to enter this Advent season, I invite you to do it with great intentionality.

We have a variety of ways to do that, from making **Advent Wreaths** to spending a day in quiet reflection at the **Advent Retreat**. The **Saint Nicholas service** tells us the story of Father Christmas and the **Blue Christmas** service serves to remind us that we are never on our own. Throughout it all are various musical offerings to help get us in the spirit. We offer all these things and more so that you will be able to move more deeply and appreciatively into the story of Christ coming into the world, as a baby, to begin His earthly life and ministry.

Jesus knows us. He knows our humanity, our joys and our struggles and He embodies for us God’s immeasurable love. May we be multipliers of this immeasurable love, seeking to be helpers in intentional ways by sharing the Gift given to us.

You are invited into a Holy Advent where we will, together, prepare the way for the Lord!

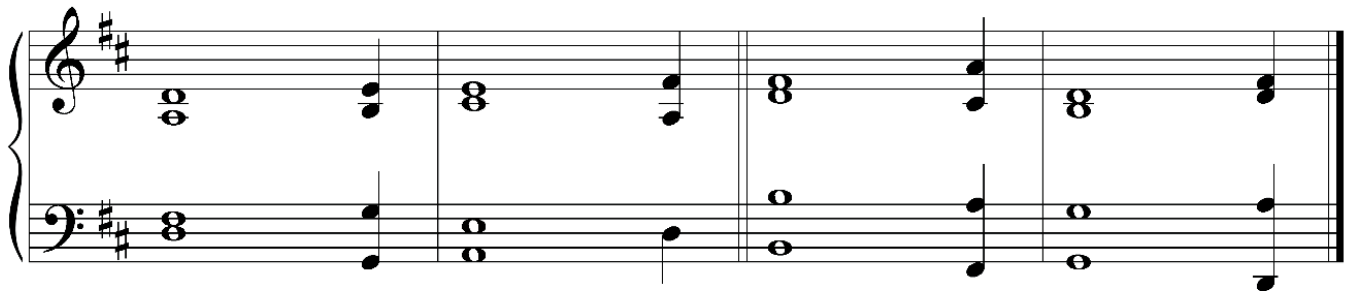
