The Season of Advent

As we continue our Advent journey today on the **Second Sunday of Advent**, we are reminded that preparing for Jesus' coming is not just about waiting passively. It's about **active participation** in God's work in the world. In the time leading up to Jesus' birth, the people of Israel were stirred by the message of the prophets and the call to prepare their hearts for God's intervention in human history.

In Luke 3:4, we hear the voice of John the Baptist calling out in the wilderness: *"Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight"*. This is a message not just for those in his time, but for us as well. He challenges us to **examine** our lives, to **reflect** on the ways in which we are called to change, to **make room** for Christ, and to live lives of justice, mercy, and humility. Advent is **a time of renewal**— a time to cleanse our hearts and lives, so that we can receive Jesus with true joy and openness.

The people who came to John asked him, "What then should we do?" (Luke 3:10). John's answer was clear: if you have two coats, share with the one who has none; if you have food, share with those who are hungry; be honest in your work; live with integrity. His message was radical, calling the people to live out their faith in tangible, practical ways. This is a powerful reminder for us during Advent. Our waiting should be active, filled with the works of mercy and love that reflect the heart of the One we are waiting for.

And in the midst of this preparation, we hear the **song of Mary** in Luke 1:47-55, a hymn of praise that echoes the theme of God's justice and mercy. Mary sings of how God has *"scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts,"* and *"exalted those of humble estate."* Her song proclaims that God lifts up the lowly and fills the hungry with good things. Mary's words invite us to rejoice in the radical nature of God's coming, a coming that overturns the powers of this world and brings hope to the oppressed.

Like the people of Israel who looked forward to the coming of the Messiah, we, too, are called to look ahead—not only to Christmas, but to **the day when Christ will come again to make all things new**.

This Advent season, please **listen carefully** to the voice of the prophets, the songs of Mary, and the challenge of John the Baptist. **Prepare your hearts** through prayer, service, and repentance. Bear fruits worthy of the One who comes in glory, bringing justice, mercy, and peace.

And with joyful expectation, await the coming of our Savior.

Christ Church Nutcracker—a Tradition That Keeps on Giving

Felicia Rhoden believed her days of teaching dance were over when Rector Jim Cooper asked her to teach ballet at Christ Church. She was 57, and considered herself retired, having just moved with her family from Atlanta to Ponte Vedra Beach.

But retirement didn't suit Miss Felicia, so she accepted Rev. Cooper's offer, and that Christmas of 1996 led her first 17 students in dancing The Nutcracker for family and friends.



She has been choreographing and directing performances of the traditional holiday story about a young girl named Clara and her Nutcracker prince every year since. This year's show, to be held 6 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 14 at the University of North Florida's Lazzara Performance Hall, will be Christ Church's 29th Nutcracker, featuring 125 dancers, most of them children and teens.



Now 86, Miss Felicia is still going strong, and looks forward to next year, when she can celebrate the 30th anniversary of her dance ministry that raises money for charity.

"One of these days God will pat me on the shoulder and say, 'it's time to put your tutu away,'" she says tells people who ask when she'll retire for good. In the meantime, she's having too much fun offering the joy of dance to children at the church, where she and her teachers offer classes in ballet, tap, hip hop and more throughout the year.

Miss Felicia is grateful for the many dedicated volunteers who help make The Nutcracker a success every year, including her daughter and backstage manager, Claire Duffy; her costume coordinator Carrie Lantzy; and Dawn Jacobs, who helps with communications, "and much more."

Last year's Nutcracker raised \$25,000 through ticket sales for several charities that help children, including Dreams Come True, Community PedsCare hospice, Amistad Orphanage in Bolivia, and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

Many of Miss Felicia's dancers begin taking classes at a young age and continue through high school because they love dancing and love dancing to help other children.

This year's Clara, 13-year-old Bria Ragatz, has been dancing in The Nutcracker for 11 years, starting as a Cherub when she was two. Following in the footsteps of her sister, Anya, who was Clara several years ago, Bria says she's "very excited" to dance the lead role.

Eva Lantzy, 17, has been performing in The Nutcracker since age 3, and as a senior in high school, tears up when she thinks about this being her last show. "It's bringing joy and the Christmas spirit to others," she says. "It's magical to watch it and it's magical to be in it." For tickets, visit <u>www.missfeliciasdance.com</u>
