Deacon Priscilla Wodehouse to Retire: Christ Church Blessed by Her Call from God By Maggie FitzRoy

A cradle Episcopalian, Priscilla Wodehouse was always fascinated by church, and for much of her life harbored a dream of becoming ordained despite obstacles in her way.

She attended college in the 1960s, years before women were permitted to be priests or deacons. Then, raising her son, Spencer, and working as an interior decorator kept her busy for many years. And since her father greatly opposed her becoming ordained, she honored his wishes, contenting herself with attending Christ Church as a parishioner.



Then tragedy struck in 2002, when her father died, and a week later her son was killed in a boating accident. "I decided I was going to let his death inspire me to be the best person I could be," she says of her son. "There were certain things I always wanted to do, and one was to become ordained."

And so, she did.

In 2012, after years of service to the church and training, she was ordained as a deacon while living in North Carolina, where she'd moved to begin a new life. She says answering her call from God to serve the church gave her life meaning as she worked with homeless people, women in prison, and with addicts in recovery from drugs and alcohol.

Then in 2018, she visited Christ Church at Christmas. Greeting her, Father Tom Reeder said if she ever wanted to serve in her former church, she was welcome.

"I told him I'd pray about it and so I did," she says. "I was here by Palm Sunday."

And she’s loved every minute since, including serving in leadership roles in the Recovery and Funeral Ministries. But now she says it’s time to retire. **Her 80th birthday was Saturday, January 18 and her last day is today, January 19, when the church will honor her between the 9 a.m. and 11:15 services with a cake and thank you cards in the dining room.**

“This is the friendliest and most loving church I’ve ever been in,” she says. Living at Vicars Landing, she plans to continue attending as a parishioner.

Mother Amy Slater praises her service. “Priscilla is a joyful and compassionate person who loves this church,” she says. “She has fulfilled her innate call from God by serving people at Christ Church, some at times of their greatest need. We’re grateful to have been recipients of her deep love and call.”

The Gospel

People **Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, hosanna in the highest!**

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. 
