I was furious! I had been conned! I was hurt, angry, wanting revenge or at a minimum, justice! So, I began to pray and read the Holy Scriptures. I was led by the Holy Spirit to read Luke 6:27-38. Read it for yourself. It was a hard scripture to read at that time, because it did not give me what I wanted to hear concerning this matter and this con-artist.

Our Heavenly Father was asking me to do the following: to love him, bless him, pray for him, have mercy for him, forgive him and his debt, don't ask for the money, don't judge or condemn him! He also reminded me all of the love, blessings, intercessions, mercies, forgiveness, paid debt with no judgement or condemnation He has for me! So, I put into action with what only faith in Christ can do, and obeyed.

Within a week the money I lent was restored and multiplied with no effort from me or my debtor. Not only was I restored financially, but Our Father also gave the eternal treasures of love, forgiveness, mercy, peace and joy! Till this day I pray for that man, that Our Savior may reveal Himself and His Love to him.

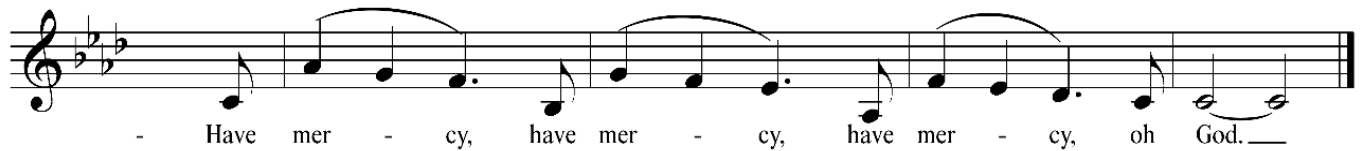

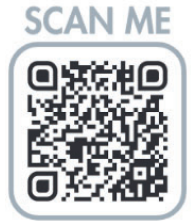


