Holy Eucharist and Foot Washing

Agape

Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Day are three episodes in one great celebration by which we die and rise to new life with Christ. In other words, immersion in this journey is life-shattering and life-creating, an experience of faith like no other. Here we touch the very heart of the Christian mystery.

Easter is time for feeling – for looking, for listening, for touching – a time for all the senses to come alive. Maundy Thursday brings us to the supper table in the dark, but what should happen here on this night – the night of betrayal? Some, with the best intentions, have chosen to celebrate a Passover Seder, but the Seder is a Jewish ritual which should not and need not be appropriated by Christians.

The Easter experience – Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Day – forms the Christian Passover. Our Seder is the Eucharist, with its twin tables of word and sacrament. Christianity and Judaism have developed into two quite different living faiths, called to reverence and respect one another's integrity. For these reasons, we offer an Agape Meal (or Love Feast) rather than a Passover Meal.

During the meal, please feel free to chat, laugh, and make as much noise as you like.

A reading of the Gospel as written to us by John

13:1-35

People

Glory to you Lord Christ

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him.

He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, “Lord, are you going to wash my feet?” Jesus answered, “You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand.” Peter said to him, “You will never wash my feet.” Jesus answered, “Unless I wash you, you have no share with me.” Simon Peter said to him, “Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!” Jesus said to him, “One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you.” For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, “Not all of you are clean.” After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, “Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another’s feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them.”

When Judas had gone out, Jesus said, “Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, ‘Where I am going, you cannot come.’ I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”

The Washing of Feet

After supper he took the cup and gave you thanks. He shared the cup with them and said, “This is my blood poured out so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me.”

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

You have gathered us together to feed on Christ and to remember all he has done for us. Fill us with your Spirit that we may follow Jesus in all we do and say, working for justice and bringing your peace to this world that you have made. Accept our prayers through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**Blessing and honor and glory and power are yours for ever and ever.
Amen.**

The Breaking of The Bread

The priest breaks the bread. The following may be said.

As this broken bread was once many grains, which have been gathered and made one bread, so may your Church be gathered from the ends of the earth into your kingdom.
