#### Buen Camino - A reflection by Julie Sturm



When Mother Amy asked if I would be willing to write a few words about our journey on the Camino, I thought that was ironic, as my heart is cracked so wide open with love and gratitude for this experience, I have trouble describing it. So here are a few thoughts, as best I can.

The ten of us covered just over 100 miles of the Camino de Santiago, in both Spain and Portugal, in 10 days, ending with a beautiful service at the Santiago de Compostela Cathedral. We walked through terraced vineyards, tiny villages and towns, woodlands, pastures, fields, and along the ocean. In the sun and in the rain. All of it so beautiful each in its own way. On occasion we got lost, but with some help from our dear guide Rui, and sometimes

other pilgrims, we found our way. Our equally dear driver John Paul was at every checkpoint with water, snacks, (he knew our favorite cookies right off!) hugs, and encouragement. Some days were harder than others, but it never seemed impossible. We also had wonderful day guides in Avila, Salamanca, and Santiago who shared so much interesting information about saints, history, architecture, and Spanish and Portuguese culture. And of course we had lovely accommodations and great food and wine!

I did not prepare for the Camino except physically, training and walking, so I was a blank slate, of sorts. As it turns out, the real lessons of the Camino are not those I think you can prepare or study for. They are gifts that come along the way, through scripture and prayer shared together in the early mornings, through laughing and talking on the trail (and conversely through silence on the trail), through acts of kindness and love, through helping and caring for one another, through tears, through serendipitous - or perhaps not - conversations with pilgrims from around the world, through communion on a mountain top and in a small ninth century church, and through moments appreciating that so many others pilgrims, from ancient times until now, have travelled this way. God's loving hand at work in the world, for sure.

As the reading on our last day said, "the finish line is for the ego; the journey is for the soul." I am so grateful for this journey.



Christ has died.


Christ is risen.




## The Breaking of the Bread
