## Disney Musical Frozen JR Coming to Christ Church - By Maggie FitzRoy



A popular Broadway musical is coming to Christ Church kid-friendly style this week when 29 talented youth present *Frozen JR.* Sept. 18-21 in the Contemporary Worship Space.

The Disney show, presented by The Creative Academy at Christ Church, will feature all the memorable songs from the animated film and Broadway musical versions of *Frozen*, and will star kids ages 11 through 16 from the church and community.

"This is the 24<sup>th</sup> show in the 14<sup>th</sup> year of the music ministry," says Producer Barb Roberts, who founded the academy in 2011 with Music Ministries Director Rachel Root and her husband Tim. The academy traditionally presents two shows a year, one for kids in the fall and an adult-focused show in the spring.

Auditions were held Aug. 2, "and there were so many great, talented kids we had to double cast," Barb says.

The show tells the story of two sisters, Anna and Elsa, and how when faced with danger, they discover the powerful bond of sisterhood. The junior version is about an hour long, about half as long as the original. "The plot is the same, with shorter scenes and songs," says Director Morgan Williams, drama and musical theater teacher at Landrum Middle School. Many of her students are in the show, as well as former students who now attend Ponte Vedra High School.

Gabby Olitsky, 14, a freshman at PVHS, says she loved her drama classes at Landrum and was thrilled to be cast as Elsa for three of the five shows. Since her role was double cast, she will perform in the ensemble for the other two shows. "This is my first musical, my first show," she says. Auditioning was "scary" but she's glad she did it and is eager to take the stage.

Cate Collins, 16, a sophomore and musical theater major at Douglas Anderson School of the Arts, will play Anna in the shows with Gabby, now her new "bestie." Cate has been performing on stage since she was in fourth grade, including once at Carnegie Hall. "Musical theater is my escape place from everyday worries. You can put a face on and not worry about your problems, just your character's problems," she says. "Theater is a great community, a loving community."

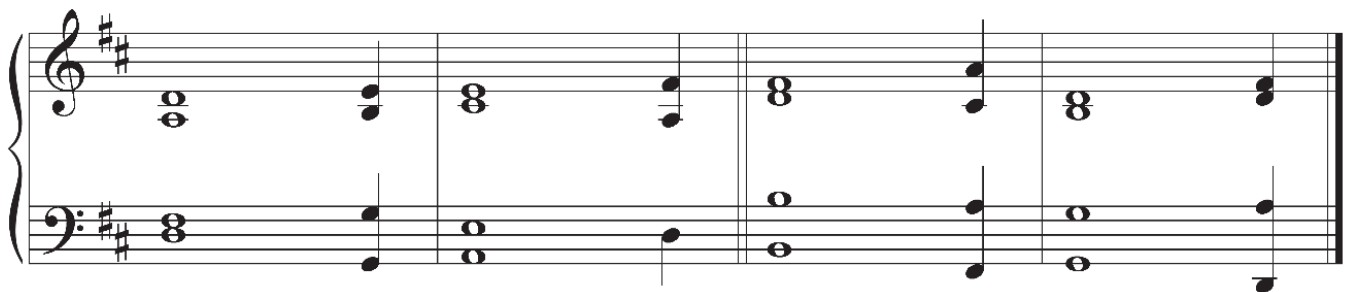
