With saints and ancestors, with the seas and earth and sky, with animals and birds, with our friends and those unknown to us, with all creation we join in the song of your unending glory:

We praise you that in Jesus you make known to us the wonder and richness of our humanity. We give thanks for his life-giving love, for his healing touch, for his vulnerability, and for his gentleness. Before he gave up his life, he shared his humanity, his flesh, and blood with his friends. He took bread, gave thanks for it, broke it, and gave it to them, saying: "This is my own body given for you. Do this to remember me."

So, too, after they had eaten, he took wine, gave thanks for it, and gave it to them, saying: "This is my blood, poured out in love for you. Do this to remember me."
