Dear Ones,

Christmas announces something too immense for words: The one and only God-of-the-entire-Universe enters fully into humanity, our humanity. Luke's Gospel gives us the visceral, historical story—a real infant being born, a real mother giving birth, real shepherds in an actual field, the gospel breaking into history. We feel the wonder of the Incarnation (the "In-flesh-ment of God) here: God is with us in a real human body.

But John's Gospel takes us deeper into what this means. Before there was a stable or swaddling clothes, before this planet was born, before stars and galaxies were born, there was the Eternal Word—through which all things were made.

This Eternal Word, which exists outside of time, and by which the whole universe itself exists, becomes human. Not metaphorically. Not symbolically. Flesh—vulnerable, dependent, mortal flesh. The eternal enters time on Christmas Day.

Both truths matter equally. The warm mystery of Luke's shepherds watching their flocks finds its ultimate meaning in John's revelation: the shepherds watching over creation, made by the very God now lying helpless in their midst.

Christmas is the moment when mysticism and manger become one. When the cosmos enters a cradle. When we stop speculating about God and encounter Him—vulnerable, real, and present.

And all for us, for our salvation, for Love's sake. This is the divine love story that is Christmas.

The Gospel

Gospeler The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

2:1-20

People **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, “Do not be afraid; for see — I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.” And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!”

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.
