Passing the Torch: The Acolyte Ministry Continues



“Serving brings fulfillment, happiness, and a sense of caring.”

These words from **Marianne Palmer** capture the heart of ministry at Christ Church—and especially the spirit of the acolyte ministry she faithfully led for more than 20 years.

As Youth Acolyte Ministry Leader, Marianne guided generations of young people, helping them grow in confidence and develop leadership skills. “I enjoyed being with the children during their years of growth,” she shared, “and providing opportunities to build confidence and leadership skills.” Today, many of those former acolytes are adults with families of their own—a testament to her lasting impact.

Now, that legacy continues with **Melissa Kurz Johnson (Mel)**, who steps into leadership with gratitude and a sense of calling.

Mel’s connection to this ministry began years ago. Growing up in the Episcopal Church, she served as an acolyte throughout middle and high school and now serves as a Eucharistic Minister.



“Marianne has done an amazing job with this ministry for many years,” Mel shares. “I know I have big shoes to fill.”

“I love being a part of the service and feel this is such an important aspect of worship,” she says. “Getting our children involved and understanding how the Eucharist works helps ensure that long-term connection to the Church.”

The acolyte ministry is open to middle and high school students who feel called to serve. Acolytes typically serve one to two times per month and receive training so they can participate with confidence. Along the way, they gain a deeper appreciation for worship, earn service hours, and become part of a meaningful community.

“My hope,” Mel says, “is to grow this into a fun group of kids who enjoy serving together.”

Rooted in Marianne’s legacy, this ministry continues to invite the next generation to serve, belong, and grow at the heart of worship.

Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd, “You that are Israelites, listen to what I have to say: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with deeds of power, wonders, and signs that God did through him among you, as you yourselves know— this man, handed over to you according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of those outside the law. But God raised him up, having freed him from death, because it was impossible for him to be held in its power. For David says concerning him, ‘I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand so that I will not be shaken; therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; moreover my flesh will live in hope. For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One experience corruption. You have made known to me the ways of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence.’

“Fellow Israelites, I may say to you confidently of our ancestor David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. Since he was a prophet, he knew that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would put one of his descendants on his throne. The Gospel

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
