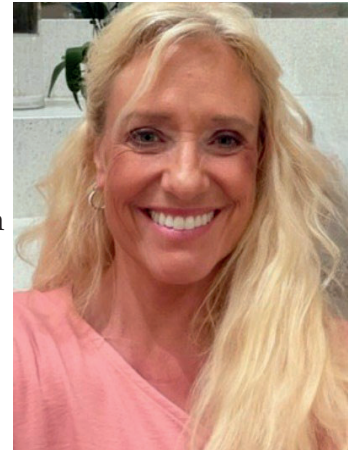

A New Song for Our Community

Christ Church is excited to welcome a new chapter in our life together as Stephanie Murray steps into the role of Worship and Family Music Director.

Stephanie brings warmth, enthusiasm, and nearly 30 years of music education experience to this role. A graduate of Concordia College with degrees in Music Education and Psychology, she has spent her life shaping children through music—in classrooms, churches, concert settings, private lessons, and theater. Many at Christ Church already know her through her wide-ranging service as preschool music teacher, children’s choir director, pastoral care coordinator, and most recently, Director of Operations.



For Stephanie, this new role is deeply personal. Having grown up as a preacher’s daughter where every member of her family played a part, she experienced firsthand what it means for children to feel known, valued, and included in the life of the church. That same vision now guides her work: to help every child and youth feel that they belong, that they matter, and that they have a place in worship.

This new music ministry will focus on building community through song, including the formation of a children and youth choir that will sing regularly in our weekend services. While striving for musical excellence, Stephanie’s deepest hope is to create a space where connection, confidence, and faith can grow together. With experience as a volleyball and running coach, a scoutmaster, and a crisis counselor, Stephanie brings a deep understanding of children from all walks of life and is passionate about the belief that music is for everyone. This ministry is for all children and youth—not just those with musical or theater experience, but anyone seeking a place to belong.

Stephanie also welcomes adults who feels called to be part of this growing ministry. Musical experience is not required—only a willing heart.

She will continue to lead key parish events, including the Oyster Roast and Celtic Celebration.

Youth, spend time with Stephanie this summer! She will lead two exciting theater camps this July. Rising 1st–4th graders will rehearse and perform *Three of a Kind*, a delightful 30-minute musical featuring favorite characters that come in threes, while enjoying a week of theater games, singing, acting, dancing, and costume design. Rising 5th–8th graders are invited to a dynamic week of musical theater featuring the award-winning *Golly Gee Whiz!*, where campers will sing, act, dance, and help design sets, costumes, and props—all culminating in a final performance.

Lector

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

17:22-31

Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, “Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, ‘To an unknown god.’ What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For ‘In him we live and move and have our being’; as even some of your own poets have said, ‘For we too are his offspring.’

Since we are God’s offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.”

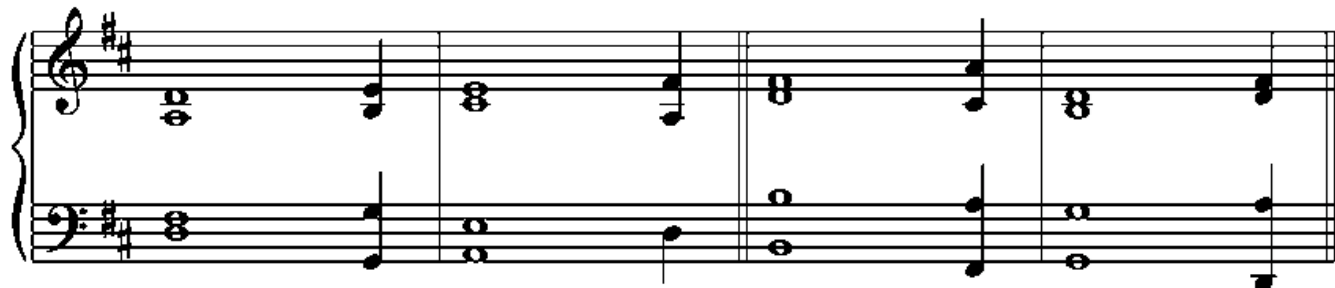

Lector A reading from the First Letter of Peter

3:13-22

Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you-- not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.
