Pentecost, Explained

The Day of Pentecost is one of the seven principal feasts of the Episcopal Church. It marks the fiftieth day after Easter and brings the Easter season to a close. On Pentecost, we celebrate the day that Jesus poured out the Holy Spirit on the disciples gathered in Jerusalem. Before his death and resurrection, Jesus had promised the disciples that he would send the Holy Spirit to them. The Holy Spirit would be a comforter, advocate, and witness for them in the work they were called to do. In fact, when Jesus spoke with his disciples after the resurrection, he told them, “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”

On Pentecost, the apostles, and other disciples gathered with them, received the Holy Spirit and tongues of fire rested on each of them as they proclaimed the wonders of God in various languages. It has been noted that Pentecost is the reversal of the Tower of Babel. There, the people built a tower to ascend to heaven and make a name for themselves, but God confuses their language. Here, God descends on the people and overcomes that confusion to proclaim the name of Jesus.

At Christ Church, we celebrate these realities in several ways. First, the liturgical color is changed to red to symbolize the fiery tongues of the Holy Spirit. Second, we hold a bilingual service with our Spanish-speaking congregation to show that we are one people united in Christ. Third, because the Holy Spirit is promised in baptism, we often celebrate this rite on Pentecost.

First Reading

Lector A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."

All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'"

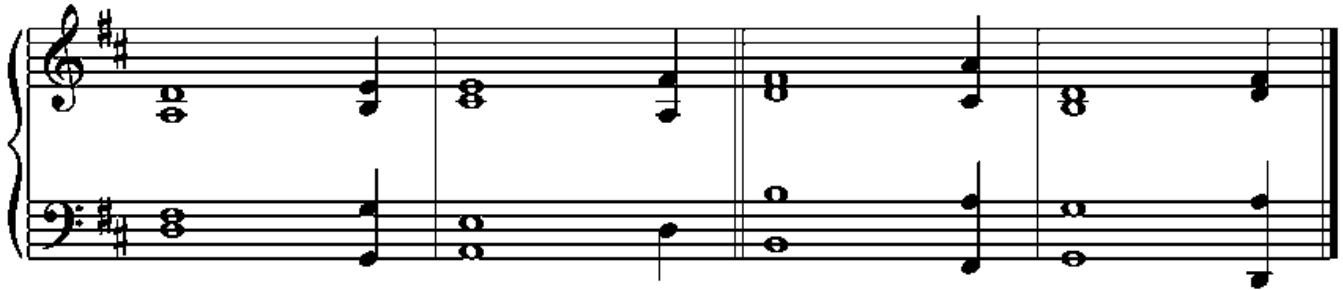

A reading from Paul's first Letter to the Corinthians

12:3b-13

No one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body-- Jews or Greeks, slaves or free-- and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.
